

HKSF National Race Officer Seminar

The HKSF will be holding a National Race Officer Seminar on the 3rd and 4th June 2017. The course is intended for experienced Club Race Officers who wish to become a National Race Officer.

Those who attend the whole seminar and pass the exam at the end can apply to become a National Race Officer upon completion of three on the water assessments as a race officer at HKSF approved events.

Entry Requirements:

Candidates must be a member of the HKSF. For those who are not already members, see the link to the HKSF website page https://www.sailing.org.hk/subpage/7dWSrTGjsddbFwMcT?lang=eng which sets out how to become a member. Membership application forms should be returned to the HKSF before 23rd May 2017.

As the course is intended to help qualify candidates to be National Race Officers it is recommended that candidates have the following qualifications or experience:

- To have completed and passed a basic race management course (such as the RYA Level 1 Race Management course or the HKSF Club Race Officer's course). Some Hong Kong sailing clubs also run race management courses which may also be considered as acceptable.
- To have been a race officer for HKSF or club organised events several times

Nomination/recommendation by yacht clubs, sailing associations in Hong Kong will be taken into account if the course is over subscribed.

Race Officers who passed the RYA Level II Race Management course are welcome to take this course as a refresher course, or alternatively can just take the on the water assessment if they wish to become a Hong Kong National Race Officer.
